### Workbook answers of poem nine gold medals

Tong su kien nay, nhing nguoi khuyt tai canh tranh de giang huy chuong vang, bac hoac dong, theo vi ti kiết thúc. (i) Athletes participating in this event have different abilities, which means that each contestant has some defects in their body. (ii) Their goal is to win the race and win themselves a gold medal, which they have practiced for many years. No one wants to lose the race, either to the second, or the third, etc. (iv) They prepare for this special event by practice and training for many years. They all put a lot of effort into winning this race. (v) All race participants have won, finally, as described later in the poem, by completing it all together, holding hands. (i) The sporting event that was mentioned, earlier in the context, was the 'Special Olympics', where all athletes were disabled in a number of ways, participating. (ii) This event is a special event, as it is designed specifically for athletes with disabilities, and is not intended for an ordinary person without a disability. (iii) The audience, which was sitting around the field, was in an enthusiastic mood, and excited. They also cheered on all the young participants of that race. (iv) The final event of the day of the 'Special Olympics', which is the last race, consisting of a hundred meters, is about to begin. (v) The first event turned out to be special, as the event expressed the ideal of sympathy, and human values, when all the participants helped an athlete, who had stumbled, and finished the race, completely. (i) 'Special Olympics' is a sporting event, designed for people with disabilities in some way, by giving them the opportunity to participate and win rewards. (ii) The type of athlete who had a certain type of disability in their body, came to participate in this 'Special Olympic' sporting event. (iii) The race, which involves athletes to cover a distance of hundreds of meters, was the first event of that day. (iv) Nine athletes, having participated in the event, stood on the starting line. They all have a state of determination, as they wait for the pistol to fire into the air, as a starting signal. (v) Events of the fall of the weak and the youngest contestant, on the track, stopped the race after it had taken off, as all eight other participants also stopped, and returned to help him. (i) Various disability sporting events, about to begin, include a hundred-meter race, who (ii) It was started by the sound of the pistol firing, which was fired, as a starting signal. Upon hearing it, all participants start the race, but Athlete stumbles. (iii) One of the athletes, weaker, and younger than all other athletes, fell on the track, as his legs gave in. (iv) As soon as the other participants in the race found that one of the athletes had fallen on the track, they immediately stopped and rushed to his aid. (v) They have come to the aid of fallen athletes, by returning, as a result of feelings of sympathy, and human values, which rise in their hearts, at that time. (i) he' was called weak, and the young athlete who had fallen on the track, as his legs gave up on him. (ii) The thought of the fact that all his hard work, and practice, and the training he did for the race is now all a waste, making him cry in frustration and suffering. (iii) The strange thing happened was the moment when all eight other participants stopped in their tracks and came back with the aid of fallen athletes. (iv) Eight contestants have abandoned their spirit of competition, as they all feel pity, sympathy for the fallen athlete, causing them to return with his help. (v) All race participants have been awarded gold medals because they are all now finished together, hand in hand together. (i) The demise of the youngest, and weaker athlete on his track, as his legs gave in, happened earlier in the scene. (ii) The event of the downfall of one of the participants in his sport fills all their hearts with sympathy, and real sport, which makes them stop in their tracks. (iii) Their surprise move to stop in their tracks, turn around, come with the aid of fallen athletes, and then finish the race altogether, with athletes falling along with him, supporting him, and hand in hand together. (iv) The human values of true sympathy and sportsmanship is expressed by their actions, since they are all not afraid of their loss, and they have helped that fallen athlete, get up and finish the race. (v) Rhyming words used in this paragraph are 'complete' and 'foot'. They make sense in some way, as this poem does not follow a set rhyme diagram, and stanza 6, and 7, are the only stanzas according to the ABCD model. (i) The last sporting event of that day, the 'Special Olympics', which was a race hundreds of meters away for athletes with disabilities, was underway. (ii) The event of the collapse of a participant in that race, which makes other athletes stop the race, when they return to help him complete the race. (iii) The fact that all eight other participants stopped their race, only to help a fellow contestant who had fallen, all making their victory, was quite shocking to the audience. (iv) The race is over when all athletes, completing it, both together, side by side, supporting fallen athletes, and hand in hand together. (v) The theme of the poem is about sympathy and human values. It is communicated through a special event race, where all eight other athletes stop, and help the athletes who have fallen, at risks hit. Side Note: If you think this poem has a lot of questions that are the same, but just write differently, and already have the same answer, then you are not alone. Because there were so many of them, almost like they were out of the idea of what questions to take, so they wrote the same thing, over and over. Treasure Trove Workbook Answers Extract 1 (i) Athletes from all over the country have arrived at the stadium where the Special Olympics are held. They came to the game and won the Gold and Bronze and Silver Medals which were words to give to the best candidates awarded to the Gold Medal of the winner. The competitors have been well prepared because they trained for months and each of them has a desire to win gold medals. (ii) A. All the contestants entered the stadium hoping to win gold. B. Excerpt 3 (i) The youngest athlete has fallen, cried. He did not cry much because he was physically hurt, but because he was suffering in the heart. He was unconscious that his gold medal hopes were lost forever. (ii) The youngest athlete has been training for months and dreams of winning a gold medal. But in this fate will happen, he stumbles and falls. Their dream of victory was scattered forever. (iv) 10 other students are running with strength. One of them fell suddenly with a gold medal. But they all stopped and the participants about to have returned to help on their feet. This approach demonstrates that they appreciate the emotions on winning medals. (v) (vi) the line depicts what the sport really means. Winning a medal is important, but this is not the most important thing. The game should be taught on human values. This is the main theme of the poem. (i) 8 other athletes came back and helped the youngest athlete of his legs. Then they all held their hands, and together they went into the finish line, how nine of them as winners. Each has a gold medal. Along with the audience, the officials gave them a standing statement. Excerpt 4 (i) Now the race starts again. Eight athletes do not want to win individual gold medals. We got involved in the hand because they wanted to win it with him, now he can't run, but he went to the finish line with the ninth athlete. (ii) 'Special Olympics' are for those with bodies who have some problems. They are not athletes in general, so this is called the Special Olympics. But the Special Olympics became really special because it was the first event in which nine gold medals were awarded in the same event. (iv) The race and game ended with the victory of 8 athletes who were not interested in winning medals. He helped the man play his falling partner. But they all won gold medals and won the sympathy of the audience. (v) All competitors were happy when they crossed the finish line at the same time. Their faces are created from happiness. Spectators were impressed with their athletic skills and make them cough. (i) The Special Olympic name was kept because it was not for athletes in general, but for those who were physically challenged. It all becomes special because athletes show unprecedented sport.
